





A German named Ernst WOLLENWEBER or WOLLWEBER is the German representative of the International of Seamen and Harbour Workers in Copenhagen, and is now working in the illegal headquarters of the Communist Party there. Although he is by nationality a German, he has been supplied with a Danish passport in the name of CHRISTIANSEN, which gives his occupation as that of a stoker and his date of birth as 1895. The attached photograph, taken at the Congress of the International of Seamen and Harbour Workers at Hamburg in May 1932, is believed to be that on his Danish passport in the name of CHRISTIANSEN; it is understood that this passport is stamped Fredriksberg-Politi.

Reliable information has been received that in August he is going on an inspection tour of all continental ports, exclusive of Germany where he would be known. It is thought probable that he will try to visit the United Kingdom, as he has been pressing the secretariat of the International of Seamen and Harbour Workers to insist on increased activity in their British section, the Seamen's Minority Movement.

Should this individual come to this country, he could only be doing so in order to indulge in undesirable activities, and I would suggest that his name might be added to the list of those persons circulated for exclusion in May 1933 (see your 659008/6 of 25.5.33). If you decide on a circular and require the usual 40 copies of the photograph, would you please let me know.



6. It is proposed in future to use some of the younger men or youths for various missions. The K.J.V.D. (German Communist Youth) supply volunteers for the above. These youths will appear in the guise of international students. Two names of such travelling students are given as:

Ernst WOLLWEBER of Breslau, and Johann MEYER, Nuremburg, Bavaria.
